
Introduction

This quarterly report is intended to present a college-wide view of external, approved proposal submissions and new awards made to college faculty and researchers. Award data are maintained by the university Office of the Vice President for Research, and are publicly available at: http://sam.research.sc.edu/awards.html. Data on proposals are sourced from the university's electronic research administration system, USCeRA.

Strategic goals are documented in the College of Arts and Sciences <u>Blueprint for Excellence</u> published by the Office of the Provost.

FY25 Strategic Goal #1: Increase extramural grant funding by 10%.

Progress to date: On target for time-phased goal as of March 31st.



Funding in \$ - Research, Service and Training

CAS faculty and other researchers have been awarded \$44.7 million in extramural funding so far this year for research, service, and training activities.

The FY2025 goal is \$59.2 million.

We are \$3.2 million ahead of where we were at this time last year.



FY25 Strategic Goal #2: Increase collaborative funding applications in the natural and social sciences.

<u>Progress to date</u>: Ahead of goal for overall submissions, but behind time-phased goal for increasing collaborative applications through March 31st.

CAS faculty and other researchers have submitted 331 proposals as Lead PI and 67 as collaborators for 398 total submissions including 20 non-competing continuations.
